# News from Westminster - Rebecca Paul MP

It remains a great honour to have been elected your Member of Parliament and I will always work tirelessly to make Reigate, Redhill, Banstead and our villages an even better place to live and work.

Within Parliament, I have worked hard alongside my Conservative colleagues to successfully fight for:

- Winter Fuel Payments to be reinstated
- Operation Defence spending to be increased
- National Inquiry on Rape Gangs

But there is so much more to do:

 Green Belt to be protected – Labour has doubled local housing targets from 644 to 1,306 per year. This is not fair or achievable – I am working with our councillors to support muchneeded new homes in places that work for existing and new residents.

- Economy imploding The Labour Chancellor's policies have caused the economy to shrink, inflation rising from 2% to 3.4%, unemployment up at 4.5% and tax hikes a practical inevitability.
- Illegal immigration out of control – The Prime Minister promised a reset with Europe and France would help stop illegal immigration – it has risen by 14% in the past year.
- Rebecca has spoken in Parliament 276 times on local and national issues since being elected Reigate's MP.

# LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION

The Government is changing the way local councils are run. In Surrey, we are moving from one county council and 11 borough councils to unitary authority control – meaning all services for an area will be overseen by a single council. We will also

## have an elected mayor for the first time.

The boundaries and how many unitary authorities Surrey will have are yet to be confirmed – please take part in the consultation on the options being considered by Government by

scanning the QR code. It closes on 5 August.

We expect the outcome to be announced by the Government this autumn and local elections to be held in May 2026.

These changes will make our town and parish councils even more important in making sure local views are heard.

Reigate and Banstead Borough Council's consultation is due to be launched shortly to understand how local people would like town and parish councils to be organised.

# Prioritising a new hospital for Sutton

Rebecca Paul is working hard alongside Jed Dwight, Conservative councillor for Chipstead, Kingswood and Woodmansterne, to press the Labour Government to prioritise delivery of the new Specialist Emergency Care Hospital in Sutton, which has been delayed until 2030 to 2035. Meaning the earliest opening date would be 2037 – this is too late.

This much-needed new hospital will consolidate emergency care into a state-of-the-art facility

allowing delivery of world class treatment quickly and safely. Even more importantly, it will enable major investment in both Epsom and St Helier Hospitals, which serve patients in the Banstead area.

Patients and staff all deserve better than to spend a further decade or longer in facilities that are not fit by modern healthcare standards. Our MP has called on Ministers to revisit their decision to delay the project. We'll keep you updated.

# £110.5m for SEND education in Surrey

The Conservatives at Surrey County Council have approved the money to expand provision across Surrey, which will deliver 2,404 more specialist school places by 2030. Cllr Jonathan Hulley is the Cabinet member responsible and says:

"Working with cabinet colleagues and building on the recent Ofsted rating of our Children's Services as Good, I want to prioritise improvements in our SEND service, including recruiting additional case workers, improved complaints handling and quality assurance, supporting closer working with schools and families, and the timely completion of the annual review and key stage transfer statutory activity."

## FIXING UP CASTLE ROAD SCOUT HUT

Cllr Simon Parnall has been working with the leaders of the 15th Reigate (Chipstead) Scouts to secure support for works at their hut at the top of Castle Road, Chipstead. As a result, new roofs have been fitted, new lighting installed, the woodland has been made safe and new hedging and fencing fitted.



## Cllr Shelly Newton has also been working on:

Arranging for Reigate and Banstead Council to fix the surfaces in our car parks in Woodmansterne Rec, Chipstead Meads, Banstead Woods and Banstead Scout Hall – A Big Conservative Win for the area and your car's suspension!

Installing a new height barrier on the car park at Woodmansterne Rec to stop trucks/lorries from entering and fly tipping at the BRING site.

Securing new disabled access gates in Burgh Heath at the entrance to Perrotts Farm (a big thank you to Burgh Heath Residents' Association for all their support) and Woodmansterne Rec.

Installing new bins across Chipstead and Woodmansterne – rodent-proof waste bins are keeping our area tidier.
