News from Westminster - Rebecca Paul MP

It remains a great honour to have been elected your Member of Parliament and I will always work tirelessly to make Reigate, Redhill, Banstead and our villages an even better place in which to live and work.

Within Parliament, I have worked hard alongside my Conservative colleagues to successfully fight for:

- Winter Fuel Payments to be reinstated
- **O** Defence spending to be increased
- National Inquiry on Rape Gangs

But there is so much more to do:

 Green Belt to be protected – Labour has doubled local housing targets from 644 to 1,306 per year. This is not fair or achievable – I am working with our councillors to support muchneeded new homes in places that work for existing and new residents.

- The Labour Chancellor's policies have caused the economy to shrink, inflation rising from 2% to 3.4%, unemployment up at 4.5% and tax hikes a practical inevitability.
- Illegal immigration out of control – The Prime Minister promised a reset with Europe and France would help stop illegal immigration – it has risen by 14% in the past year.

Locally, I'm working on the following campaigns:

- Fixing our roads pressing for more funding for local roads (we have the 5th busiest road network in England) and replacing the road surface between J8&9 on the M25 to cut noise.
- Reigate Station improvements — longer platforms to allow 12-car trains and avoid the need to split trains at Redhill, which adds 5 minutes to journeys — watch this space. The big win so far is that Contactless is coming to Reigate Station later this year!

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION

The Government is changing the way local councils are run. In Surrey, we are moving from one county council and 11 borough councils to unitary authority control – meaning all services for an area will be overseen by a single council. We will also

have an elected mayor for the first time.

The boundaries and how many unitary authorities Surrey will have are yet to be confirmed – please take part in the consultation on the options being considered by Government by

scanning the QR code. It closes on 5 August.

We expect the outcome to be announced by the Government this autumn and local elections to be held in May 2026.

These changes will make our town and parish councils even more important in making sure local views are heard.

Reigate and Banstead Borough Council's consultation is due to be launched shortly to understand how local people would like town and parish councils to be organised.

Tackling crime and ASB in Redhill Town Centre

The Safer Redhill initiative is a partnership between Surrey Police, the Conservative Police and Crime Commissioner, Lisa Townsend, Reigate and Banstead Borough Council and East Surrey YMCA to tackle crime and strengthen community pride. Since it was launched in 2024, drug operations have been taking place and plain-clothes officers are patrolling at night.

So far there have been 155 arrests, a combined 25 years of prison time handed down, 86 drug seizures (including 10kg of suspected cocaine) and weapons removed from the streets. However, it isn't all about enforcement – it is also about prevention. East Surrey YMCA and its qualified youth workers are providing vital support to vulnerable young people.

Safer Redhill is a powerful example of what can be achieved by working together. Thanks to all involved, residents feel safer and businesses have a renewed confidence in Redhill's future.

Lisa Townsend has just announced Safer Streets is also being extended to Reigate.

£4.5m to reopen Harlequin PLUS more arts and culture in Redhill

Fantastic news for the area. Not only is the Harlequin to reopen after RAAC is removed but Reigate and Banstead Borough Council is opening a new space in The Rise and seeking a new provider for its arts and cultural programme. The works at the Harlequin will take some time to complete but we will keep you updated with progress.

Redhill Library has moved temporarily to the Belfry Shopping Centre until works have been completed at The Harlequin – the library is on the upper floor and all services are still available.

LONDON ROAD CAR PARK IMPROVEMENTS

Speed bumps are now in place to stop anti-social behaviour and speeding. Kate Fairhurst, councillor for Reigate, campaigned alongside local residents

and says, "Local people were worried that an accident was waiting to happen - The speed bumps as well as cutting back vegetation have helped to improve the situation and we'd like to thank the Council and the Police for taking action."



SUPPORTING LOCAL BUSINESSES AND PROTECTING OUR HIGH STREETS

Earlier this year, Rich Michalowski, councillor for Redhill West and Wray Common, led on Planning Policy to make sure our ground floor shops and offices are no longer able to switch to residential under

Permitted Development rights.

This has saved shopping parades, high street shops

and commercial buildings in Redhill and Merstham from automatically becoming residential properties.
